Denis had been invited to the Royal Engineer Museum as part of the veteran's group he belongs to, and borrowed some my models to display.


Not really a model show, but an opportunity to show off our interest group. There were lots of displays, both inside and outside of Royal Engineers equipment and displays.

Commonwealth War Graves Commission article

For those of you who don't know, I'm a volunteer for the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. I've had an interest in military cemeteries and the work of the CWGC for several years, going back to when I spent several years touring the Western front on holidays.

Many are familiar with the immaculately maintained war cemeteries on the continent, but there are 177,000 headstones in the UK, which are spread over 12,500 sites. There are 177 sites containing CWGC burials in Warwickshire. Many burial grounds just have one burial, these are known as scattered graves.

The Commission inspects all graves on 2-to-5-year cycle, but to speed up response to work and repairs, a project called Eyes On, Hands On (EOHO) was conceived. Local volunteers with a knowledge of local cemeteries, would be able to keep an eye on the condition and report any issues, also they could be trained to carry out basic cleaning and gardening requirements.

The initial, project was launched a couple of years ago. Due to an overwhelming response the existing system was found to be unsuitable, and because it was during the lockdown period, it was been used as a sort of treasure hunt. The project was relaunched at the beginning of this year, which is when I first came across it. It was initially an advert on Facebook, asking people to become involved. I filled in an application form, which required references, and then received a phone call from the area supervisor before being accepted as an official volunteer.

Due to the Covid lockdown, all the initial training was carried out by zoom. This consisted of learning what to look for, and how to fill in the report forms, each report is accompanied by photographs. The CWGC has just initiated a new digital archiving program, which now is used to store all the photographs which get uploaded. In the future, this will probably form the basis of the Commission archives.

As well as the familiar CWGC headstones, there are over 37,000 private memorials. These were chosen by the family instead of a Commission headstone. Although the CWGC does not own these private memorials, they do monitor their condition, to ensure that the individuals name is legible.

The locations for which I am responsible are Nuneaton based, there are four of us based locally, and if the need arises, we will meet up to carry any large-scale cleaning tasks. The headstone cleaning can only be done using water and a scrubbing brush, and if needed a bit grass cutting with a pair of shears.

The private memorials tend to be in worse condition, they have often been neglected for years. Because they are private, we are not allowed to touch them. Only photograph and report on the condition.

At one of my churchyards, is a private memorial to an able seaman named Morton. I have located his family grave and he should be the third inscription down. Unfortunately, over the years the gravestone has sank into the ground and his name is no longer visible. Following my site report, this person will be given a plinth marker, so his name will once again be visible for those who wish to remember him.


